

### **God Does Big Things With Small Acts of Faith**

Church planters today often choose fast-growing urban or suburban centers as their base for ministry. Josh Kuck chose the opposite; a small, highly-relational community in Michigan.

From the time of their launch in September of 2017, Main Street Church in Chelsea has had the intention of being a church that reached deep into its community with the gospel, building long-term redemptive relationships.

Pastor Josh, along with his wife Andrea and their four daughters, moved to Chelsea in 2015 to begin laying the groundwork for what would eventually become Main Street Church. Now, nearly three years after their public launch, the church holds two services each Sunday morning with average weekly attendance between 200-250.

When reflecting on the previous five years of ministry effort, Pastor Josh shares one of his biggest lessons learned:

"It takes a great deal of time fostering relationships, especially with unchurched people, to see the Kingdom reward of the time, energy and love extended. We have to be dependent on God's timing, which is often seemingly slower than we might like to see things move."

Nonetheless, the church has grown at a steady pace since 2017 and is consistently seeing unchurched people begin a transformative walk with Jesus.

When Pastor Joel Trainer and his team from Movement Columbus launched their church in early 2018, they were outsiders attempting to make inroads for Jesus. In just two short years they are integrated into the city of Gahanna, Ohio.

"God is counting things that can't be counted. I'm a competitive guy and it can sometimes lead me to focus too much on numbers and keeping score. But there is more in God's hands that He is doing than I can count."

A relentless pursuit to connect lost people to the Gospel is a necessary attribute for any church planter. Throughout his entire life in ministry, Joel Trainer has been driven to put himself in a place to be used by God. Today, that usefulness is being played out as he leads Three Creeks Church to be visible and relevant

ministers to the community of Gahanna, OH.

In just two years, Three Creeks has grown from a launch team of 40 people to a church of over 200, offering two Sunday morning worship opportunities. But more important than the size of Sunday services is the relative impact that Three Creeks is making in its community.

Pastor Joel reflects on the deep roots that the church now has in the city:

"We have connections with the mayor and the school board superintendent. God has given us tremendous favor as we are now often seen as the church for the future of our city."

Now settled in a home in their new community, the Carraways are initiating new relationships and building the core team for the much-anticipated launch of Church at the Well.



# **Church Planting is Not Just a Job. It's in Your Heart**

Scott Avey, Grace Fellowship, Brunswick, MD, reflects on the first two years as a new church

"I love these people and I love our mission and I can't imagine being anywhere else." - Pastor Scott Avey

After launching its public services in an elementary school gym in February of 2018, Grace Fellowship has had its share of ups and downs. Church planting is not easy. It's not for the faint of heart. And it's not for everyone.



But Pastor Scott and his team have weathered their storms, leaning into their call from God to bring life to the lost and purpose to the living. In fact, they feel that they were better prepared to deal with the interruption of the COVID-19 crisis as a result of the fact that they had already endured some sifting and refining.



"Church Planting starts off really glossy. But eventually you start to realize the room you're worshipping in smells like ham sandwiches and not everything works out the way you had planned it. That's when church planting requires grit. You have to dig to a deep place to remember your purpose."

Pastor Scott sees the grit in his team as a tremendous gift from God. He is grateful for those that have stuck it out in difficult times.

The church has taken the COVID-19 season to reevaluate some options for their Sunday meeting location. At the time of this writing, their future in the elementary school is uncertain. But God has opened a door to a partnership with another local church and a shared location.

Another note of excitement for Pastor Scott is that they have seen an upswing in families with teenage students attending the church and this has allowed them to launch a student ministry to serve those families.
